



Residential Curbside Recycling Program

The Southwest New Brunswick Service Commission would like to welcome you to our new Curbside Residential Recycling Program! We have attached some useful information for you to refer to on your new recycling adventure.

- Participation in the Blue Carts is Voluntary
- Acceptable recycling material will be placed loose in the blue cart, no bags allowed
- Blue carts are assigned to each Primary Residents and are the responsibility of the resident
- Recyclables placed in blue carts are collected at the curb
- Only carts assigned and/or approved by the SNBSC will be used to participate in the residential curbside system
- Collection personnel will only collect accepted recyclable materials
- Carts used for non-recyclables will not be collected. Residents will be notified when cart is not acceptable.
- Recycling pick-ups are on a pre-approved schedule of every 4th week with current waste haulers, with regular garbage picked up on the other 3 weeks (no garbage pick-up on recycling week)

Accepted Recyclables

- Paper
- Cardboard
- #1 plastic (PETE) containers
- #2 plastic (HDPE) containers
- #4 plastic (LDPE) containers
- #5 plastic (PP) containers
- #7 plastic (OTHER) containers
- Paper cups
- Metal food cans – rinsed and dry
- Milk cartons – rinse and dry



Materials Not Accepted

- Glass bottles
- Styrofoam
- Plastic Bags
- Any Plastic Film



<p>PAPER & CARDBOARD</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Newspapers -Advertising Flyers -Magazines, books and telephone books -Office papers, envelopes -File folders -Invoices, receipts, lottery tickets -Brown paper bags -Flat cardboard (cereal box) -Egg cartons -Corrugated cardboard -Milk and juice cartons (Tetra Pak) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Breakdown cardboard boxes -Remove the bags of waxed paper or plastic in the cardboard boxes as much as possible, -Remove the plastic handle and metal openings on the cardboard boxes 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Metallic paper -Packaging tape -Laminated and waxed Paper -Carbon paper and blotting paper -Tissue paper and paper towels -Dryer sheets -Disposable diapers and materials soiled by food
<p>METAL</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Cans Metal and aluminum cans -Aluminum containers and packaging (plates, dishes, balls of foil) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Rinse all containers -Remove all food particles 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Materials soiled by food - Electrical and Household Appliances – -Hazardous waste (aerosol, paint, oil, batteries, cleaners, propane cylinder, etc.)
<p>PLASTIC</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Containers of soft drinks and spring water, food trays -Food containers (margarine) -household products (bleach, laundry, etc.) -Health care (shampoo, hand cream) -Food containers -Plastic lids, food containers -Food containers (Tupperware, yogurt, ice cream) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Rinse all containers -Remove the bottle caps -Compact container -Separate plastic packaging from other materials (cardboard, paper, etc.) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Polystyrene : glass, plates, small yogurt containers, -Styrofoam -Agricultural plastic sheets -Plastic bags, -Cellophane and plastic films -Toys (made with multiple materials) -Building and hardware materials -Reusable bags, pool liner, plastic fences, etc. -Clothing, footwear and accessories (belts, wallets, etc.
